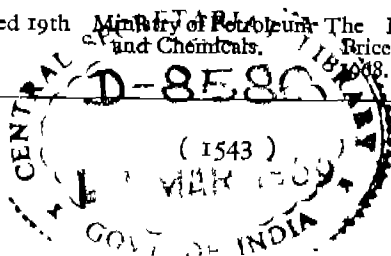

G.S.R. 1247.—In pursuance of sub-rule (1) and first proviso to sub-rule (2) of rule 4 of the Indian Administrative Service (Cadre) Rules, 1954, the Central Government, in consultation with the Government of "WEST BENGAL" hereby makes the following further amendments to the Indian Administrative Service (Fixation of cadre Strength) Regulations 1953:

Amendment

In the Schedule to the said Regulations, under "WEST BENGAL";

(i) for the entry:

"Secretaries to Government 8"

the following shall be substituted:

"Secretaries to Government 7"

(ii) the following entry shall be added:

"Commissioner for Home Affairs and Secretary, Home Department. 1"

2. The amendment shall come into force with effect from the date of its publication in the Gazette of India.

MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING

New Delhi, the 21st June 1968

G.S.R. 1248.—In exercise of the power conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment Rules, 1964, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting No. G.S.R. 1776, dated the 30th November, 1964, namely:—

(i) These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment (Fifth Amendment) Rules, 1968.

(ii) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the Schedule to the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment Rules, 1964, against Serial No. 34, relating to the post of Clerk Grade II/Teleprinter Operator,—

(i) in column 5, for the existing footnote, the following footnote shall be substituted, namely:—

"A common seniority list will be maintained for Clerks Grade II/Teleprinter Operators working in All India Radio Stations and offices located in a State or a group of States and Union territories, as indicated below, and promotions and transfers shall be made within a State or group of States and Union territories on the basis of the said list".

States or Groups of States and Union territories for which common seniority list will be maintained.

1. Assam, Nagaland, Manipur, Tripura and N.E.F.A.
2. Andhra Pradesh.
3. Bihar.
4. Delhi.
5. Gujarat.
6. Kerala.
7. Madras, Pondichery and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
8. Mysore.
9. Maharashtra, Goa.
10. Madhya Pradesh.
11. Orissa.

12. Pujab, Haryana, Union territories of Chandigarh, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir.
13. Rajasthan
14. Uttar Pradesh.
15. West Bengal.

1. These rules may be called the Central Apprenticeship Council (Amendment) Rules, 1968.

2. In the Central Apprenticeship Council Rules, 1962, for Clause (d) of rule 3, the following Clause shall be substituted, namely :—

“(d) not more than 17 representatives of the State Governments.”
