MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING

New Delhi, the 1st September 1966

G.S.R. 1463.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Central Information Service Rules, 1959, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting No. G.S.R.-217(CIS), dated the 16th February, 1959, namely:—

1. (i) These rules may be called the Central Information Service (Third Amendment) Rules, 1966.

(ii) They shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of March, 1960.

2. In the Central Information Service Rules, 1959, to rule 4, the following Explanation shall be added, namely:—

“Explanation.—In the Junior Administrative Grade, posts in the Junior scale (Rs. 1,100-50-1,400) and those in the Senior scale (Rs. 1,300-60-1,600) shall be inter-changeable.”

G.S.R. 1464.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting No. G.S.R. 24, dated the 23rd December, 1963 namely:—

(1) These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment (Second Amendment) Rules, 1966.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963 in the Schedule, after Serial No. 6 and the entries relating thereto, the following shall be inserted, namely:—

G.S.R. 1465.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 47 of the Indian Railways Act, 1890 (9 of 1890), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Railways Red Tariff Rules, 1960, namely:

1. The rules may be called the Railways Red Tariff (Fifth Amendment) Rules, 1966.

2. In the Railways Red Tariff Rules, 1960,—

(1) for sub-rule (3) of rule 1, the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“(3) They shall apply to the carriage by rail of the dangerous goods specified in these rules but not to the carriage of explosives and certain
