in the same manner as is laid down in Chapter IV of the Welfare Fund Rules for the recovery of duty of excise by the Commissioner.

- (5) Within one month after the Commissioner makes an assessment of any despatches of coal and coke etc., he shall send a copy of the assessment order, in Forms E and G of the Welfare Fund Rules, to the President.
 - (6) For the proper accounting of the duty collected under this rule, the President shall maintain records to show the particulars of assessment and collection of duty.
 - (7) The President may, by an order in writing, delegate any power conferred on him under this rule, to any other person.
- 13C. *Rounding off of the collections.*—(1) For the purpose of the levy of the duty of excise, the actual weight of a consignment, rounded off to the nearest tonne, shall be taken into account.
- (2) In collecting the amount of the duty of excise payable on any consignment, a fraction of a paise shall be rounded off to the nearest paise.

8. In the said rules, for rule 14, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:—

- "14. *Payment, deposit and application of duty of excise.*—(1) The proceeds of the duty levied and collected under rules 13, 13A, 13B and 13C shall first be credited to the Consolidated Fund of India, and the Central Government may thereafter, from time to time, as Parliament may, by appropriation made by law, provide in this behalf, transfer to the Committee such sums of money as it may think fit.
- (2) The moneys referred to in sub-rule (1) shall be applied towards meeting the expenses of the Committee and Station Committee and of the construction, maintenance and upkeep of the Rescue Stations.

G.S.R. 1564.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class II Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1962, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting No. 347, dated the 6th March, 1962, namely:—

1. These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class II Posts) Recruitment Third Amendment Rules, 1964.

2. In the Schedule to the All India Radio (Class II Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1962 after Serial No. 12 and the entries relating thereto, the following shall be inserted, namely:—
