PRASAR BHARATI - THE CORPORATION

INTRODUCTION

Prasar Bharati being the only public service broadcaster in the country reaching remote parts of the country ensures that it carries forward the social responsibility of informing, educating and entertaining the people of India. It has the widest network through both Radio and TV, with All India Radio and Doordarshan as its constituents.

Prasar Bharati came into being on November 23, 1997 by an Act of the Parliament. The Act gave Prasar Bharati the mandate to organize and conduct public broadcasting services to inform, educate and entertain the public while ensuring balanced development of broadcasting in the country.

Prasar Bharati has a phenomenal reach, covering even the remote and far-flung areas of the country. To do this, it maintains one of the largest broadcasting infrastructure networks in the world. It has about 1968 terrestrial transmitters for 450 TV and Radio stations of Doordarshan and All India Radio as well as 40 Earth Stations.

OBJECTIVES

As per the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990, the major objectives of the Prasar Bharati are as follows:

- To uphold the unity and integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the Constitution;
- To promote national integration;
- To safeguard citizens' rights to be informed on all matters of public interest by presenting a fair and balanced flow of information;
- To pay special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health and family welfare and science and technology;
- To create awareness about women's issues and take special steps to protect the interests of children, senior citizens and other vulnerable sections of the society;

- To provide adequate coverage to diverse cultures, sports and games and youth affairs;
- To promote social justice, safeguarding the rights of working classes, minorities and tribal communities.
- To promote research and expand broadcasting facilities and developments in broadcast technology.

THE PRASAR BHARATI BOARD

Prasar Bharati is governed by the Prasar Bharati Board to ensure that the public service objectives are met. The Board is headed by the Chairman and includes: an Executive Member, Member (Personnel), Member (Finance), six part-time Members, one representative of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MIB) and the Director-Generals of All India Radio and Doordarshan as ex-officio Members of the Board.

The tenure of Chairman is three years subject to the maximum age limit of 70 years, while the Executive Member has a tenure of five years (subject to an age limit of 65 years). The Members (Finance) and (Personnel) are full-time members, with a six-year tenure each (subject to an age limit of 62 years). The Prasar Bharati Board meets at least six times in a year.

The Board functions at the apex level, ensuring formulation and implementation of the policies as per the mandate in the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990. The Executive Member functions as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO). Officers working in the Prasar Bharati Secretariat assist the CEO, Members (Personnel) and (Finance) in integrating actions, operations, plans and policy implementation as well as looking after the budget, accounts and general financial matters.

PRASAR BHARATI- PUBLIC SERVICE BROADCASTER

The goal of the Public Service Broadcasting (PSB) is to meet community needs which exist beyond traditional geographic and institutional boundaries. Prasar Bharati has achieved this by making sure that both All India Radio (AIR) and Doordarshan (DD) provide the widest coverage in the country.

Prasar Bharati has ensured that this medium has lived up to its potential to inform, educate and entertain people. It has also ensured that this immense social responsibility, mandated by the Act, is carried out by using the potential of its network to reach the people in every corner of the country.

The mandate of Prasar Bharati is non-commercial in spirit. The goal of public service broadcasting the world over is to make essential information available at everyone's doorstep. It has to be wide ranging in its appeal, reliable, entertaining, instructive and informative, serving only one master, 'its public'. And true to this spirit, both Doordarshan and All India Radio, have been engaged in multifarious activities, to ensure that their role as public broadcasters is fulfilled.

The service provided by Prasar Bharati touches the lives of millions each day, providing experiences of the highest quality in cultural and performing arts, information and public affairs documentaries and educational programming. Prasar Bharati engages all communities through thought-provoking programmes and outreach projects. It channelizes information and ideas to help communities improve socially, culturally and economically.

In today's rapidly changing world, the aim of Prasar Bharati is to keep the best of what it does and re-invent the rest. The future promises to be exciting as well as challenging. It is ensuring that it keeps abreast with the digital age by using new technologies to provide better service and programmes to an even wider and more diverse population.

Akashvani and Doordarshan's contributions to the forging of a common Indian identity of 'one nation, one memory' have been considerable. Both of them have played a critical role in the cultural unification of the country with their pan-Indian coverage. Their contribution to public service can be visualized from varied content woven around catchy melodies, lyrical imagery and sentimental memories which has developed a unique homogenisation across the country. AIR and Doordarshan have succeeded in serving diverse linguistic groups in their own languages and dialects, unmatched by any other public service broadcaster in the world.






ORGANISATION CHART




PROFILE OF AIR, DD NETWORK AND COVERAGE

PRASAR BHARATI INITIATIVES DURING THE YEAR 2012-13

The role of Prasar Bharati being a national broadcaster, there is a constant and continuous emphasis on reaching the remote parts of the country including tribal belts, border areas and other areas, which are difficult to access in the normal course. Thus, revenue generation by Prasar Bharati cannot, in the normal sense, be comparable with other private channels, whose primary objective remains profit making, without any of the responsibilities of public service broadcasting, mandated to Prasar Bharati.

The constant endeavour to increase its reach by creating additional infrastructure, both terrestrial and satellite, to reach remote, tribal belts and border areas, is part of Prasar Bharati's expenditure, which cannot be related directly to earning revenue and hence, cost effectiveness.

FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS

Prasar Bharati is working under heavy financial constraints and has remained a loss making unit for the State, due to its social mandate. However, financial restructuring of Prasar Bharati has been under consideration of the Government since 2006 through a Group of Ministers (GoM). Some recent initiatives to put Prasar Bharati back on the path of financial recovery include income tax exemption, waiver of loan in perpetuity (Rs. 4258 crore), interest waiver (Rs. 3278 crores), waiver of capital loan including loan for CWG 2010 (Rs. 1841 crores) and interest thereon (Rs. 1200 crores), penal interest (Rs. 144 crores) and converting loan into grant-in-aid, waiver of accumulated arrears of space segments and spectrum charges accrued up to the fiscal 2011 (Rs. 1350 crores).

These incentives have benefited Prasar Bharati to the tune of Rs. 12071 crores during the fiscal 2012-13. Plan capital support will henceforth be through grant-in-aid, without any loan component and Non-Plan support for the next 5 years will meet 100% expenses towards salary and other related expenses.

The Central Government has approved the use of the National Emblem by Prasar Bharati.

MANPOWER AND ADMINISTRATIVE CONSTRAINTS

Coupled with financial problems, Prasar Bharati has also been facing other problems on the administrative front. Against the sanctioned strength of approximately 48,000 posts, about 16,800 posts are vacant. This has been due to various factors:

- The Prasar Bharati Recruitment Board, as envisaged in Prasar Bharati Act, not being set up.
- Recruitment Regulations for more than 125 cadres not being finalized.
- Departmental Promotion Committees (DPCs) not being held.

With the support of MIB, attention is now being paid to these aspects and efforts are being made to find solutions to these problems faced by Prasar Bharati. Some of the important steps taken during this year by Prasar Bharati to ease its difficult Human Resources situation are:

- Recruitment of posts with Grade Pay less than Rs. 4600 through Staff Selection Commission as a one time measure, pending setting up of Prasar Bharati Recruitment Board;
- Finalization of Recruitment Regulations;
- Expediting Departmental Promotion Committee's (DPC), by setting up High Power

Committee of Experts. 34 DPCs have so far been held, benefiting 1033 officials;

- Grant of Ad-hoc promotion to a number of employees who were stagnating without any promotion for more than 20 years since their appointment;
- Giving Current Duty Charge of higher posts in various cadres;
- Giving in-situ promotion to 1297 employees to reduce shortage of officers in higher posts and also promoting stagnating employees;
- Giving relief to casual assignees, especially in Jammu and Kashmir (they are not to be disengaged, with payment for the actual days of booking and also given age relaxation in direct recruitment);
- Engaging retired persons and other experts on contract to fill large number of existing vacancies.
- Cadre restructuring;
- Regularisation of 24 adhoc Cameramen Grade II;
- Appointment on deputation/contract at the level of ADG and DDG in various disciplines viz., Programme, Security and Lands and Buildings against vacant posts; and
- Formulation of a Standard Operating Procedure for compassionate appointments.

Since Prasar Bharati Secretariat does not have any sanctioned strength, staff has been engaged from either AIR or Doordarshan to work in the Secretariat. However, both Directorates also have large number of vacancies. Prasar Bharati has referred to MIB, a proposal to create 181 posts for the Secretariat. Pending creation and filling up of these posts, some retired officers have been engaged on contract to look after the secretarial work. 1150 critical posts (out of 3452) which had lapsed as they had not been filled up for a long time, have been revived with the support of MIB and approval of Ministry of Finance. For the remaining posts, a proposal has already been referred to Department of Expenditure through MIB. Pending revival of the remaining posts, requisition for 2935 posts has been placed with SSC.

PROGRAMMING ISSUES

In spite of Prasar Bharati's vast infrastructure, programming on the network has suffered due to large scale depletion of Programme Staff coupled with the fact that no recruitment has taken place over the past 20 years. This has led to the increased dependence on outsourced programmes in DD. However, content in AIR remains to be produced in-house and continuous efforts are being made to improve programming and to make the system transparent, dynamic and quality driven.

COMMERCIAL REVENUE DIVISION

Prasar Bharati has set-up Commercial Revenue Divisions in major cities to enhance in-house marketing and generate more ways of earning revenue. These Divisions are functional in New Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Guwahati, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram and Jalandhar. Divisions located in Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai have been designated as zonal hubs.

Commercial Revenue Divisions of Prasar Bharati aim to bridge the gap between the media market and the programming segment to ensure that best market practices are followed in AIR and Doordarshan. Strategic and aggressive marketing methodologies of these Divisions contribute to overall revenue generation.

Presenting a single window facility for all channels of All India Radio and Doordarshan to the client, the Commercial Revenue Divisions cater to all needs of advertising. Reaching out to clients, preparing media plans according to their budget and requirements, executing their publicity campaigns and producing spots / jingles and sponsored programmes are some of the important functions of these Divisions. With Prasar Bharati's vast network, the Marketing Divisions help clients reach every nook and corner of the country and act as facilitation centres for agencies/clients.

To bring professionalism and enhance the sale of commercial airtime, Prasar Bharati encourages cross channel publicity on AIR and Doordarshan. This forms part of the commercial deal by either extending similar facility of equivalent value across both networks or providing revenue generation for the organization.

Some of Prasar Bharati's major clients include the Ministries of Agriculture, Consumer Affairs, Drinking Water and Sanitation, Minority Affairs, Rural Development, Health and Family Welfare; Home Affairs, Human Resource Development and organisation like National Aids Control Organisation, National Disaster Management Authority, Petrol Conservation Research Association (PCRA) an private clients such as Tata DoCoMo, Coca Cola, Perfetii, Airtel, Vodafone, Dabur, Hindustan Lever, Hero etc.

Some Initiatives Being Taken to Meet the Challenge of Private Channels:

- Expansion of DTH platform.
- Digitization for better picture quality.
- Better reach to Cable and Satellite homes through monitoring of violation of Cable Act.


- Increasing transmission network capacity through digitization.
- Mobile TV through terrestrial networks.
- Thrust on increased number of FM transmitters in 12th Plan having connectivity through mobile phones.
- Border area coverage increased to cover Pakistan, Nepal and Middle East Countries.

PRASAR BHARATI ARCHIVES- AIR AND DD


- All India Radio has been in service since 1936 and Doordarshan (TV) since 1959 and the archives and libraries of AIR and DD are one of the largest repositories of audio and audiovisual material in the country.
- In terms of social significance, historic value and cultural worth, these collections form one of our greatest national treasures.
- ➤ AIR began digitizing archival content in 1990 and DD in 2003.
- ➤ 20,000 hours each of audio and audio-visual analog content have been digitized.
- About 1960 hours of identified audio visual content have been archived with metadata.
- ➤ 81 Audio CDs and 77 DVD's of music maestros, dance and iconic audio visual series like 'Bharat ek Khoj' have been released for sale.




ORGANISATION CHART



Growth of AIR Coverage Since Independence




Growth of AIR Transmitters

TERRESTRIAL COVERAGE OF ALL INDIA RADIO (AS ON 31.03.2013)







Programme Composition of broadcasts by Local Radio Stations of AIR:-
















NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

The News Services Division is headed by Director General News. It works round the clock and broadcasts over 651 news bulletins. The bulletins are broadcast in the home and external services networks in Indian and foreign languages. There are 44 Regional News Units broadcasting regional news and providing inputs for National/Regional news.

EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION

The External Services Division of All India Radio broadcasts in 15 foreign and 12 Indian languages. These services are aired for an aggregated duration of 71 hours daily. It is beamed to over 100 countries.

TRANSCRIPTION AND PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE

Transcription and programme Exchange service is in charge of exchange of programmes between various starions; building and maintenance of sound archives; release and marketing of recordings of music maestros.

RESEARCH DEPARTMENT

This department is in charge of R&D of relevant equipment required by AIR and Doordarshan. It also conducts investigation and studies required by AIR and Doordarshan. It is involved in development of prototype models for limited use and field trials.

CENTRAL STORES OFFICE

This office is responsible for procurement, stocking and distribution of engineering equipment required for the maintenance of all technical equipment in All India Radio Stations.

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE (PROGRAMME)

The Corporation has its own Staff Training Institute (Programme) setup in 1948, is located at Kingsway Camp, Delhi. The institute imparts in-service training and short duration refresher courses for Programme and Administrative staff. It also conducts induction courses for new recruits and conducts departmental examinations for administrative staff.

There are Regional Training Institutes at Bhubaneswar, Hyderabad, Shillong, Lucknow,

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE (TECHNICAL)

The Corporation also has a Staff Training Institute (Technical) for engineering staff of AIR and DD. The institute functions from Kingsway Camp campus in Delhi. Training courses are organised from the level of Technician to Superintending Engineer. It also conducts departmental, qualifying and competitive examinations. The Corporation also has a Regional Staff Training Institute (Technical) at Bhubaneshwar.

CBS CENTRES AND VIVIDH BHARATI

There are 37 Vividh Bharati-cum- Commercial Broadcasting Service (CBS) Centers including exclusive VB Centers, responsible for marketing of airtime. The CBS centers coordinate with the Central Sales Unit, located in Mumbai, for airtime sale, billing, accounting, client service, agency registration etc.

ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR 2012-13

- The major achievement of the International Relations (IR) unit of AIR was winning the first prize in the 'Mini Feature' category by AIR Thiruvananthapuram. The feature 'Pen Kunju' (The Girl Child) won this accolade at the International Radio Festival of Iran (IRFI 2012), held in Iran. The Programme Executive, Sh. Biju Mathew, received the award at Zibakenar, Iran.
- A total of four entries from AIR were shortlisted amongst the finalists during the IRFI 2012 in different categories. Their producers were invited by the host, Islamic Radio of Iran Broadcasting (IRIB), to participate in the festival held in May, 2012.
- The IR unit participated in international media events, conferences, training workshops, competitions and implementation of Cultural Exchange Programmes (CEPs). This unit also made sure that Prasar Bharati's opinion was heard on issues related to foreign broadcasting and media organisations.
- Programme entries from AIR stations were sent to many international competitions such as
 Asia Pacific Institute of Broadcasting Development (AIBD) Awards 2012, Asian Broadcasting
 Union (ABU) Prizes 2012 and International Radio Festival of Iran (IRFI 2012).

IR Unit also coordinated exchange of radio programmes with other countries under the CEP
 Agreements signed between the respective governments. Under one such agreement, AIR

broadcast Bulgarian music programmes on two occasions. Agreements for cooperation in different fields of radio broadcasting were signed between Prasar Bharati and the Korean Broadcasting System (KBS), South Korea; the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) and Tunisia Radio.

- During this period, delegations from many countries visited Prasar Bharati/AIR with the objective of developing an understanding for cooperation between their Radio and TV organisations and Prasar Bharati.
- All India Radio was elected to ABU's Administrative Council for a three year term. The
 Administrative Council is the policy making body of ABU and consists of 15 elected members.
- AIR joined hands with UNICEF to broadcast important social messages on health, particularly
 on eradication of Polio. The IR Unit coordinated four Skill Building Workshops organized
 by UNICEF for AIR programmers. Over 100 Programme Executives and presenters from AIR
 participated in these workshops held at Bhopal, Delhi and Faridabad.

FARM AND HOME BROADCAST

For more than five decades, All India Radio has provided dedicated services for its rural

audiences. AIR's Farm and Home programmes are broadcast by all its stations. Programmes cater to the seasonal needs of farmers, incorporating latest information and technology for good agricultural produce and create awareness to improve the quality of farming practices. These programmes are broadcast in the morning, afternoon and evening, with an average duration of 60 to 100 minutes per day.

The Farm and Home units of AIR broadcast composite programmes which include equal segments of rural development schemes, hard-core agriculture, related subjects like Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Poultry and Dairy Farming, Fisheries, Forestry, Environment Conservation and allied agriculture activities like food and agro processing, dry and wasteland agriculture. Segments dwelling on employment schemes, loan, insurance and training facilities, sanitation, health hygiene and nutrition etc. are also broadcast. Programmes are also designed for rural women, children and the youth.

With the launch of 'Kisanvani' in collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture, AIR has expanded its agricultural broadcasts. This programme is relayed by 96 AIR stations and keeps local farmers informed about daily market rates, updated weather reports and gives day to day information in their respective areas at micro level. Broadcast on a narrow casting mode, the Kisanvani programme is mostly interactive in content, involving field based recordings of farmers and studio dial outs and dial ins with experts and the farming community. The programme has become very popular with its target audience.

To spread awareness, AIR stations publicised the demonstration of soil testing and DNA finger printing technology for seed testing, organized by the Ministry of Agriculture during the India International Trade Fair -2012, in New Delhi.

Special publicity campaigns for the protection of plant varieties, farmers' rights authority, livestock census done by the Department of Animal Husbandry, were given extensive publicity by all AIR stations. Campaigns on National Food Security Mission, crop advisories, drought situation, bird flu etc. were also broadcast.

RADIO KISAN DIWAS

AIR celebrated February 15 as Radio Kisan Diwas. Farmers who were benefited by the information disseminated through AIR's agricultural programmes shared their experiences with other fellow farmers in their regional language/dialect. Stations broadcasting Kisanvani also invited senior district administration authorities, university experts and selected farmers as audience for shows on the day.

ENVIRONMENT

AIR broadcasts programmes on themes such as wildlife and animal care through its special audience programmes. These programmes publicise the success of initiatives which take place in forestry, wildlife conservation and maintaining ecological balance.

World Environment Day was observed by AIR stations on June 5, 2012 with special awareness programmes. This year's theme was 'Preserving Biodiversity'. Issues such as social forestry, preventing land degradation and desertification, ozone hole depletion, climate change, water harvesting and noise pollution were part of the programming. Almost all AIR stations gave special coverage to the Biodiversity Express- the interactive mobile exhibition of the Ministry of Environment which covered 25 States and 100 stations.

HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE PROGRAMMES

Health programmes are part of the regular broadcasts of AIR, covering subjects such as 'Necessity to raise age of marriage', 'Delay the first child', 'Space between two children', 'Terminal methods', 'Maternal care', 'Child survival' etc. AIR also covered important issues such as promotion of inter-spouse communication/male responsibility, neutralizing male preference syndrome, Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP), promotion of institutional legal provisions, management of Reproductive Tract Infections (RTIs) and sexually transmitted infections (STIs), AIDS, drug abuse, breast feeding, labour, girl child, disability, T.B, leprosy and reproductive child health etc.

Wide publicity is given to generate public awareness on blood and eye donations. Programmes against drug abuse, tobacco consumption, illicit trafficking, AIDS and raise awareness

about rehabilitation and facilities being provided to leprosy affected persons/families were aired by AIR stations.

Special programmes to create awareness of the adverse child sex ratio and to alter negative mind-sets which lead to abortion of girl child foetus are broadcast in different formats by all stations. Publicity was also given to the Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques Act (Regulations and Prevention of Misuse) Act- 1994 to create public opinion against female foeticide.

AIR registered audience groups participating in special audience programmes like Rural/Women/Youth and Health contribute towards spreading general awareness on these subjects. Special efforts have been made to create awareness on global iodine deficiency disorders. All AIR stations give wide publicity to the IEC- campaign against malnutrition. Stations have also broadcast programmes on Dengue and Chikungunia under 'Arogaya Bhartam'. Programmes on 'Ageing and Health', eye care, and case of persons with disabilities have also been broadcast.

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMES

Specialised programmes for children between the ages of 5 to 7 years; 8 to 14 years and rural children are broadcast by all AIR stations. Plays, short stories, features, choral singing, interviews, stories from epics etc. are part of these broadcasts. Bal Diwas, was celebrated on November 14, 2012, with special activities for children, stage shows and invited audience programmes on the theme "Bacche Swasth – Gyanwan, Nirbhik Bharat Ka Nirman."

WOMEN'S PROGRAMMES

Programmes for women on AIR cover subjects related to socio- economic development of women, health and family welfare, food and nutrition, scientific home management, women entrepreneurship, education including adult education, women empowerment, gender issues, social awareness about the rights and privileges of women through propagation of legal literacy etc. Special programmes focusing on the status and importance of girl child are broadcast throughout the year to create social awareness.

Different traditional folk forms are used to communicate with the rural audience.

International Women's Day/Week is observed in the month of March every year with special programmes on women related issues in different formats with the theme: "Hamari Beti Desh Ka Samman."

TRANSCRIPTION & PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE OF ALL INDIA RADIO

The Transcription Service of AIR was started on April 23, 1954 with the mandate of preparing the

transcription of dignitaries' speeches, especially those of the President and the Prime Minister. This unit also processes vinyl discs, called "AIR- TS records," to preserve recordings for future broadcasts. The unit's name was changed on April1, 1959 to "Transcripts and Programme Exchange Service." With changes in technology, the department added new modes of preservation like analogue magnetic tapes, etc., in keeping with the times. Archiving activity has also been assigned to this department. Functionally, this unit is now composed of the Central Archives, Programme Exchange Unit (Internal & Foreign), Transcription of President/Prime Ministers' speeches, Refurnishing Unit, Commercial Release & Marketing and Digital Sound Archives.

RELEASES FROM AIR ARCHIVES: "AKASHVANI SANGEET" AND MARKETING

AIR has a rich repertoire of Indian Classical Music, both Hindustani and Carnatic, in its archives. AIR Archives have started releasing selections from this precious music collection under the banner "Akashvani Sangeet". So far 71 albums have been released.

Sales counters have been opened at 50 AIR stations, many Doordarshan Kendras and some retail music shops in Delhi.

SOUND ARCHIVES

The Sound Archives of All India Radio can be called the "National Audio Archives" as it is a treasure house of music and spoken word recordings of more than 16,500 hours in different categories. It is the largest library of Indian Music recordings with more than 12000 tapes of Hindustani, Carnatic and folk music.

The library preserves a separate collection of Mahatma Gandhi's speeches, including the first and the last prayer speeches of Mahatma Gandhi, recorded on May 11, 1947 at Sodepur Ashram, Calcutta and November 29, 1948 at Birla House, Delhi, respectively. The only broadcast of Mahatma Gandhi from AIR Delhi on November 12, 1947 is also preserved. Over 3000 analogue tapes of the recordings of Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru are preserved in the AIR Archives.

Voice recordings of eminent personalities such as Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, Sardar Patel, Sarojini Naidu etc. have been preserved. Apart from this, award-winning Radio Dramas, Features, Documentaries etc. and memorial lectures are available in the library. The library contains recordings of all the Presidents and Prime Ministers of India.

Radio Autobiography

More than 252 recordings of eminent personalities from various w a l k s of life are available with AIR. With inputs from different AIR stations, people of eminence are identified and Radio

Autobiographies recorded. In the year 2012-13, eminent personalities like Ebrahim Alkazi, Pandit L.K. Pandit, Rajendra Gangani, Pandit Surinder Singh etc. have been recorded.

Archives Digital Library

A special project launched in 2001 to digitise all archival recordings was completed in 2005. With this, Akashvani possesses one of the major digital libraries in the broadcasting network, with modern tape numbering system, in tune with internationally accepted norms.

Programmes transferred into digital medium are of approximately 16,400 hours, these include recordings of Mahatma Gandhi: 280 hours; President's speeches: 1,250 hours; Prime Minister's speeches: 3,300 hours; Sardar Patel: 35 hours; Gurudev Tagore and recordings on Tagore: 175 hours; Radio Autobiography: 525hours; Hindustani Classical: 3,100 hours; Carnatic Classical: 1,450 hours; Light Music: 1,050 hours, Folk and Tribal Music: 600 hours.

In the second phase of digitisation which began in 2008, approximately 500 hours of recordings have been digitised. Approximately 5,000 hours of programmes in analogue tapes are to be transferred to the digitized format in this phase of digitisation.

Digital Sound Archives

The Transcription and Programme Exchange Service has taken up a mega project of digitizing all analogue content. Under the Chairmanship of CEO Prasar Bharati, a special committee of experts in the field of archiving, both technical and content management has been formed. The 'Technology and Options Committee' guides the Digital Sound Archives in adopting best practices. AIR participated in the 6 day Annual Conference of International Association of Sound Archives (IASA). International experts visited the Archives, appreciated the available facilities and gave valuable inputs for their modernisation.

ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE YEAR 2012-13

- Expansion of Transcription Unit.
- Archives Appraisal Committee set up in every AIR station.
- Creation of work flow for analogue and digital content.
- New Archival gallery showcasing writers, artists, events, instruments etc.
- Upgradation of storage facilities by providing 24 x 7 air conditioning and safe housing of archival material at 18 degrees temperature.
- Guidelines formulated for selection of archival content for preservation and dissemination enunciated.

PROGRAMME EXCHANGE UNIT LIBRARY

Exchanging good quality programmes among the different stations is the main purpose of this unit. The PEU library has approximately 8000 tapes containing recordings of music and spoken word programmes. Besides audio material in different Indian languages, PEU library also preserves language lessons in Bangla, English, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Oriya, Sanskrit, Tamil and Telugu. The PEU has a separate reference library of Folk and Tribal Music in all principal languages and dialects of our country.

Transcription and Programme Exchange Service (T and PES) has been allotted a fixed time slot between 1100 hrs and 1200 hrs for transmitting programmes to all AIR stations through Radio Network Channel. This includes programmes from Sound Archives, Programme Exchange Library, Radio Serials, Lessons on Languages and Community Singing Songs (which are received from the Community Singing Song cell of Directorate General of AIR). Outstanding programmes requisitioned by various stations and also contributed by stations (PEU Library) are also circulated.

The Programme Exchange Library circulates radio serials to identified radio stations. These radio serials are produced under the software development project of PP and D unit of the AIR Directorate. Monthly chain plays produced by the Central Drama unit of the AIR Directorate are also circulated to radio stations through regular RN channel chunk.

Transcription Unit

The main function of this unit is to transcribe recordings of speeches delivered by the President and Prime Minister and preserve them in the form of volumes in chronological order.

It is obligatory on the part of AIR stations to record speeches delivered during public functions by the President and Prime Minister. Taped recordings of speeches along with transcripts are received by the T and PES from AIR stations. Bound volumes of all transcripts are prepared and kept in the archives. All speeches of the President and Prime Minister are also catalogued and preserved in CD form with detailed data entry.

COMMERCIAL WING

The onus for generating revenue for All India Radio lies with its Commercial Wing. In spite of the rapid emergence of Private FM channels and their obvious commercial stakes, the Commercial Wing of AIR through the Central Sales Unit at Mumbai, 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service Centers and 10 Marketing Divisions located in different parts of the country, has been able to augment the commercial revenue of the organisation, even while maintaining its basic identity as a Public Service Broadcaster.


A prescribed Code of Conduct governs the programmes as well as commercial broadcasts on All India Radio. While strictly adhering to the Broadcast and Commercial Codes and facing budgetary and staff constraints at almost all AIR stations including CBS Centers, Vividh Bharati stations and FM channels, the Commercial Wing has been able to procure business from major corporate clients/advertisers as well as Government Departments and PSUs.

To face the stiff competition prevailing in the market, the Commercial Wing is in the process of revising/rationalizing its tariff card, making it more client friendly and competitive. Special Package Rates for FM Channels as well as Vividh Bharati Channels are being introduced.

The Commercial Wing has continued its 1:1 Bonus Schemes for spot bookings on all Primary Channels, Local Radio Stations, FM as well as Vividh

Bharati Stations. While monitoring such market-friendly schemes, the Commercial Wing is in constant touch with clients and advertisers at all levels so as to convince them to invest a major part of their ad-spends on All India Radio - the only medium which covers the entire country. Marketing Divisions and CBS Centers provide cost-effective media plans for their clients, giving cost effective opportunities of publicising their products or services within their budget.

The Commercial Wing of All India Radio has been able to give strategic feedback to policy makers of the Programme Wing in order to make radio broadcasts more effective in the current competitive media environment. In fact the Commercial Wing has undoubtedly given good results, boosting the overall revenue of the organisation in the last few years.





SPORTS

During the year 2012-13, All India Radio provided quality coverage for various international, national, regional and local sporting events. Some of the more prominent Sports broadcasts included the **London Olympics Games 2012**, which was the biggest sporting event of the year.

Details of AIR's extensive coverage is as follows:

- o **Pre-games programmes:** Programmes broadcast from April to June 2012, twice a month, alternately in Hindi and English and once in July, 2012 on national hook-up, as a build-up to the Olympics, from AIR Delhi and relayed by all capital AIR stations and other stations. Regional language versions of these programmes were broadcast by non-Hindi capital AIR stations the next day and relayed by other AIR stations in respective language zones.
- O Curtain Raiser: Curtain Raiser programme was broadcast from 0705 to 0730 hrs, on 27th July, 2012 by AIR, Delhi and relayed by all capital AIR stations, FM Gold Network and other AIR Stations. Regional language versions of the Curtain Raiser were broadcast by the non-Hindi capital AIR stations on the same day and relayed by other AIR stations in respective languages zones.
- o Daily Highlights: 25 minute capsules of the daily highlights of the Games were broadcast from July 28 to August 13, 2012 by all capital AIR stations, FM Gold Network and other AIR Stations. The regional language versions of these Daily Highlight Capsules were broadcast by non-Hindi Capital AIR stations during the morning transmission on the same day and relayed by other AIR stations in respective language zones. Besides a round-up of the day's activities and results, these capsules included sound-bites of participating international and national sports celebrities such as Usain Bolt, Roger Federer, Serena Williams, Saina Nehwal, M. C. Mary Kom, Vijay Kumar, Gagan Narang, Sushil Kumar, Sania Mirza, Leander Paes, Krishna Poonia, etc.

- Opening and Closing Ceremonies on July 27 and August 13, 2102, respectively.
- Men's Hockey: All India specific matches, both Semi-Finals and the Final match.

- o **Updates on FM Rainbow:** Hourly updates of about 5 minutes duration were broadcast on FM Rainbow network from 1530 hrs. to 0230 hrs for the entire duration of the Games. Latest information a long with sound bites was broadcast on FM Gold and FM Rainbow channels, breaking into their usual programmes whenever a medal was won by India. Some results were also broadcast live during the updates.
- o **Updates for the Sports Scan Programme and New bulletins:** Regular updates were given to News Services Division, All India Radio for the duration of the Olympic Games.

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE

The Staff Training Institute (Programmes) located at Kingsway Camp, Delhi, is responsible for training of in-service Programme and Administrative personnel of All India Radio and Doordarshan. There are six Regional Training Institutes at Bhubaneswar, Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Shillong and Thiruvananthapuram, to service each zone. STI (P) coordinates with each regional institute to conduct training courses as and when required.

SPHERE OF ACTIVITIES

In- house Training Courses for AIR and DD staff

The training institutes of Prasar Bharati aim at creating an effective workforce by developing competence, expanding horizons, sharpening intellect and developing inherent skills. Courses are designed to foster and facilitate the skill sets of the staff, increase awareness and equip them to meet new challenges. Combined management courses for Station Directors and Station Engineers are also organized in order to achieve close coordination and cooperation amongst the technical and programme staff. Comprehensive training programmes are based on varied subjects like, Leadership Skills, Management, Financial Administration, Budget and Accounting, etc. A series of systematic training programmes like "Radio Agri-Vision" for agriculture and rural broadcasters at all training institutes, Media and Gender Sensitisation, Programme Management, Marketing Strategy and Communication, Management Programme for senior officers, Election Broadcasts New, Media, Archives etc., are also conducted.

Administrative courses are held for the Administrative staff as well as the staff posted in the Programme and Engineering Wings of AIR and Doordarshan. Almost 156 in-house workshops and training courses were conducted in the year 2012 by all STIs (P)/RTIs (P). As part of the Annual Training Calendar for the Year 2012, subjects like RTI and Record Management, Disciplinary Procedures and Departmental Inquiries, Advance Computer Applications, Reservation in Services, Copyright and Intellectual Property Rights, Establishment rules, Purchase Management, Station Management, Handling Court Cases etc. were included. Amongst these, four courses on 'Hard Disc

Based Recording System/Digital Audio Production and Editing and Virtual Studio' were conducted in coordination with the STI (Technical) for Programme officers of AIR.

OUTSIDE PAID COURSES

Voice Articulation and Nurturing Initiative (VANI) Certificate Course

All India Radio's Announcers/Presenters/ Comperes and News Readers have set the style in presentation for this medium. Based on this unique expertise, Staff Training Institute (Programme) has designed courses for performers in broadcast media. The five day VANI Course helps in honing the skills of presenters. Candidates for this course are selected after auditions at each station and then trained. About 68 such courses were conducted during 2012-13in which a total of 1,115 participants were trained.

AUDIENCE RESEARCH UNIT

Almost all big media organisations conduct in-house audience research in one form or other, as no media organisation can afford to put their scarce resources at stake without knowing the potential market for their media content. They also subscribe to syndicated research done by media and market research organisations. The success of private TV and Radio channels lies in their capability to feel the pulse of the audience through continuous audience research and their ability to design and modify programme content including presentation accordingly.

All India Radio has been a pioneer in this field. It has a wide network of Audience Research Units across the country, operational since 1946. These Units provide programme feedback to producers, enabling them to plan, design and modify programmes according to the needs, tastes and aspirations of the target audience. Apart from this, programme ratings/listenership data are provided to sponsors, advertisers, and marketing professionals to fulfil their commercial objectives. Audience Research Unit also functions as a data bank and reference section for the organisation.

NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

The News Services Division(NSD) of All India Radio broadcasts around 651 bulletins daily in about 91 languages/ dialects in Home, Regional, External and DTH Services. The total duration of these bulletins are 55.04 hours. About 346 news headlines are broadcast every hour in FM mode

by various AIR stations. The NSD broadcasts 179 news bulletins from Delhi every day, a total of 21.42 hours.

"Regional News Units" are AIR's window to take news to the common man in the remotest areas of the country, in their own regional language and dialect. 44 RNUs across the nation work like an extended arm of the News Services Division to fulfil its objective to present news in the most objective and fair manner for the listeners of All India Radio. While each State has at least one RNU, some states have two RNUs, and Maharashtra has four RNUs. Though AIR Kargil does not have a RNU, it has been broadcasting news bulletins since 2008.

44 Regional News Units (and Kargil Station) produce 472 news bulletins including 290 headline bulletins, 172 home service bulletins and 10 external service bulletins in 77 languages/dialects. Three new bulletins in Marathi were started from RNU Aurangabad on April 1, 2012. Besides, there are number of news based programmes from each RNU. A News-on-Phone service from 13 RNUs is updated hourly. Production of news bulletins and news-based programmes are handled by Indian Information Service (IIS) officers with more than 100 full-time correspondents/editors working with the RNUs. There are 6 non-RNU correspondents in different locations.

The Best RNU Award is presented by NSD every year for initiatives taken by the units to improve existing new-based programmes or for efforts to make special programmes.

NSD website www.newsonair.nic.in, a multilingual news website, won the prestigious Web Ratna Award- 2012 for its outstanding content. Besides accessing the latest Regional, National, International, Business and Sports News, visitors to the site can listen to audios of 186 news bulletins/ news- based programmes in 29 regional languages including English and Hindi. Scripts of 109 news bulletins in 27 languages are also available on the website. It has a huge archive, podcasting and RSS feed facilities. AIR's FM Gold and Urdu Services are streamed live on the website. A mobile news app was developed to provide news on Android based mobiles. Audios of two more regional bulletins were introduced on the website during this period, taking the total number of regional audios to 84. The popularity of the website increased by 20 percent during this period, with the average number of daily visits increasing to 45,596 in March 2013 from 38,270 in December 2012. The site now receives an average of over 8 lakh daily hits.

NSD made available AIR news and programmes on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube in January 2013. At present there are over 2700 followers of @airnewsalerts on Twitter and more than 25,000 likes on the All India Radio News page on Facebook. Two 5- minute news capsules each in Hindi and English are uploaded daily on MIB's You Tube channel by NSD. A Social Media Cell has been created for NSD and six professionals/interns have been hired by NSD to increase outreach of AIR News on various social media platforms.

The novelty of NSD lies in its "News- on- Phone (NOP)" service and SMS which enables the public to hear latest information on sports, current affairs, business news, weather reports and international news.





Recordings of News studio

NSD prepares daily and weekly programmes on current affairs, national and international issues It presents new initiatives and innovative programmes of the government for Aam Aadmi, acting as a catalyst for social change. NSD highlights crucial issues in its daily bulletins and daily and weekly news based programmes.

NSD and the RNUs together broadcast 1405 news based programmes per month. The total duration of these programmes are 211 hours, 25 minutes.

Major issues/events which were covered in various news bulletins, news based programmes and features of NSD during the year 2012-13 are as under:

- The flagship programmes of the government, including Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) Scheme, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Mid-Day Meal Scheme, Jawahar Lal Nehru Urban Renewable Mission (JNURM), Public Information Campaign (PIC), Bharat Nirman, Empowerment of Women, Right to Information (RTI), Integrated Child Development Scheme (ICDS), Rajiv Awas Yojna and Rural Telephony.
- Changing face of villages under MGNREGA and its successful completion of 6 years, Role of Panchayati Raj Institutions, skill development of youth in villages in power production, role of Asha in sanitation, recharging groundwater, National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology, bio- toilets and sanitation campaign, supply of clean drinking water in rural areas and other flagship programmes.

- Expansion of National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) as National Health Mission was highlighted. NSD broadcast programmes including fight against Malaria, Health Care of the Elderly, Mental Health in India, Epilepsy, Utility of Breast Feeding Week, Eye Donation Fortnight, Importance of First Aid, Prevention of Dengue, Steps to curb Iodine Deficiency disorder, World Polio Day, Menstrual Hygiene Management, Measures to check Diabetes, Significance of World Diabetes Day, awareness drive against Smoking, Gutka and Tobacco consumption and role of Red Ribbon Express—III to check HIV/AIDS in the country.
- Exclusive coverage of the benefits of Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in Multi Brand Retail, Aviation, Broadcasting, Power, Insurance and Pension Sectors.
- Extensive coverage of the direct cash transfer system for the marginalised sections of the society through Aadhaar scheme to fight corruption, strengthen Public Distribution System (PDS) and check price rise, launched by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh in Rajasthan. The Government provided Rs. 100 crores during the 12th Five- Year Plan for development of community radio in the country. This and other developmental aspects were given due prominence in news and news based programmes.
- Policy initiatives of Government including Prime Minister's address to the nation from the ramparts of Red Fort on Independence Day, his commitment to Lok Pal and Lokayukta bill for speedy delivery mechanism, his address at the International Convention on Biodiversity in Hyderabad, direction to transform India as an international scientific hub, call to the scientists to follow the ideals of Sir C V Raman and Sir J C Bose, call for joint action by the Centre and the States to fight corruption, appeal to insurgent groups in North East to come to the negotiating table for talks, advice to further strengthen Centre State relationship, on National Counter Terrorism Centre (NCTC) to combat terrorism, stress on modernisation of armed forces, etc. were all covered extensively by the NSD.
- Visit of the Prime Minister to Japan and Myanmar, his participation in the G-20 summit
 in Mexico, Rio +20 summit in Brazil and talks with US President Barack Obama, Mexican
 President Felipe Calderon, Russian President Vladimir Putin, German Chancellor Angela
 Merkel as well as French President Francois Hollande, address during the Tehran NonAligned Movement (NAM) summit, his talks with Presidents of Iran and Afghanistan
 and the Prime Ministers of Bangladesh and Syria.
- Award of Bangladesh's highest civilian award to the former Prime Minister, the late

ENGINEERING ACTIVITIES 2012-13

Growth of Network and Coverage

AIR is one of the largest broadcasting networks in the world. At the time of Independence there were six Radio Stations and 18 Transmitters (6 MW and 12 SW), covering 11% population and 2.5% area of the country. By the end of the financial year 2012-13,the number of stations in the AIR network increased from 277 to 376 and number of transmitters from 433 to 546 (143 MW, 48 SW and 355 FM), covering 99.19% of the population spread over 91.87% area of the country.

SPECIAL PACKAGE FOR J&K

Phase-III - The scheme includes setting up of four 10 kW Transmitters at Green Ridge (Uri Sector), Himbotingla (Ladakh Region), Natha, (Patnitop, Jammu Region) and the 4th Transmitter at existing TV site at Naushera. In addition, four Low Power 100 Watt FM Transmitters have already been installed and commissioned at Kargil, Drass, Tiesuru and Padam during this year extending AIR's coverage area.

Phase – II of North-East Special Package:

Special Package for expansion and improvement of AIR services in the North East region and Island Territories is under implementation, this includes:

Nineteen 1 KW FM stations in: Arunachal Pradesh: Anini, Bomdlia, Changlang, Daporjio, Khonsa; Assam: Karimganj, Lumding and Goalpara; Manipur: Ukhrul, and Tamenglong; Meghalaya: Cherrapunjee; Mizoram: Tuipang, Chemphal and Kolasib; Nagaland: Wokha, Zunheboto, Phek;

Tripura: Udaipur and Nutan Bazar. 16 sites out of 19 required for these new FM stations have been acquired and transmitters at 9 places have been installed (Goalpara, Udaypur, Kolasib, Lumsing, Nutan Bazar, Tuipang, Daporijo, Champhai and Cherapunji). Work for remaining eight places is in progress.

Gangtok – 10 kW FM Tr and Silchar – 5 KW FM Tr: 10 KW FM transmitter at Gangtok has been commissioned and 5 KW transmitter at Silchar is under commissioning.

100 W FM relay transmitters at 100 places: Installed at 94 places including 5 installed during the current year. Four transmitters are under installation and two have been diverted to other locations. These 100 Watt FM Transmitters will extend FM coverage in uncovered rural and semi urban areas (from existing AIR/LPT sites of Doordarshan).

Chinsurah (West Bengal) –1000 kW MW Tr. (Replacement of existing 1000 kW MW Tr.) – Transmitter has been installed and under testing.

Kavaratti (Lakshadweep) – 10 kW MW Tr. (Replacement of 1 kW MW Tr.)

Transmitter received and under installation.

Digital Satellite News Gathering Systems (3 Nos) – Equipment has been deployed

New Initiatives:

As part of Digitization Scheme approved by the Government under the 11th Plan, following activities were undertaken during the current year: -

Digitization of 98 studios – Equipment like hand-held recorder, phone in console, portable digital recorder and OB Mixer, DG Sets etc. have been procured and in use.

Replacement of 31 old MW Transmitters by new DRM MW Transmitters at existing stations – 20 kW (5 Nos.) are under installation.

Upgradation of MW DRM Transmitter with captive power plant in Arunachal Pradesh - 20 kW transmitter at Tawang has been installed; order has been placed for 100 kW and 200 kW transmitters for Passighat and Itanagar respectively.

Replacement of 10 KW MW Mobile transmitters by MW DRM transmitters has been completed at 6 places.

New 1 KW (12 Nos.) /5 kW (12 Nos.) FM Transmitters have been supplied at 24 places.

Replacement of 5x SW Transmitters by DRM SW Transmitters - 500 kW SW Tr. for Bengaluru is under installation.

Augmentation of 44 existing New Units and Creation of 7 New Regional News Units – Hardware has already been installed at all RNUs and augmentation process has been completed. Software is being provided

ACTIVITIES OF I-T DIVISION:

AIR Urdu and FM Gold audio streams are available through webcasting services. Encoders are installed in New Broadcasting House and two multiplexed audio channels are delivered at NIC for internet streaming through 2 Mbps digital leased line. Link is available in www.allindiaradio. org.

Streaming of News channel for Android mobile phones started in the month of March 2013 as a pilot project. YouTube based services have also been started. **allindiaradio.org** website has been revamped and hosted by NIC with LISTEN LIVE and YouTube services.

Court Case Monitoring System:

A web based application for monitoring all on- going court cases in Prasar Bharati has been developed. Starting with the entry of a new court case to recording all proceedings and maintaining the history of each case, this software generates a list of proforma reports which includes List of Pending court cases, List of cases which are likely to be challenged/ or face contempt, Cases coming up for hearing in next 'N' days, Court wise and subject wise summary reports enable officers to refer to the list and pursue the case accordingly. It has facilities to upload all documents related to a case and send email alerts to concerned officers related to cases coming up for hearing in the next 14 days.

PROGRESSIVE USAGE OF HINDI

The Hindi Unit of A.I.R., Directorate (Headquarter) is dedicated wholly in implementing the official language policy of Union of India and constantly strives to implement the orders/instructions issued from time to time by Ministry of Home, Official Language Department and implementing targets mentioned in Annual Programme in various offices of AIR. Apart from the implementing the official language policy in the year 2012-13 by Hindi Unit, the following special and notable work were carried out:-

HINDI SAMMELAN

Prasar Bharati has taken measures for implementation of reservation in respect of SC/ST/OBC categories. All policy directions and instructions issued by Nodal Ministries/Departments for benefits to these categories are being complied by all offices and field units of Prasar Bharati. All Capital Stations have been instructed to nominate Liaison Officer to look into issues affecting the SC/ST employees and redress their grievances.

Instructions have been issued to monitor implementation of statutory instructions to safeguard the interest of staff members.

In order to ensure awareness among staff members, a two days workshop on "Reservation Policy and Rosters" was organised on December 27&28, 2012.

PUBLIC GRIEVANCE AND REDRESSAL MECHANISM

Grievance redressal and access mechanism has been set up at Stations, Zonal Headquarters and both the Directorates General in accordance with the guidelines of Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances. Information and Facilitation Counters have been setup at all offices of Prasar Bharati. Regular status reports on disposal of grievance cases are being submitted to the MIB.

IMPLEMENTATION OF RIGHT TO INFORMATION ACT 2005

All Prasar Bharati Radio Stations/DDKs have broadcast a number of programmes in different formats on the provisions of the Right to Information Act, 2005 in order to

inform, educate and empower people and contribute to transparency and accountability in governance. Programme Heads of all AIR Stations/DDKs have been asked to highlight the salient features of this Act This Act has also been covered under Flagship Programme since September, 2008.

At Prasar Bharati Secretariat and all AIR and DD offices including field offices, CPIOs have been nominated. Appellate Authorities have also been designated at requisite levels as per requirement.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

In Prasar Bharati, the overall percentage of women in Group 'A' & 'B' & 'C' Categories is about 24.6%, including women posted at senior levels.

All Stations/Offices have set up Women's Cell to look in-to the grievances/ complaints of sexual harassment.

WELFARE ACTIVITIES FOR WOMEN EMPLOYEES

- Adequate arrangements have been made in all offices to ensure proper illumination, security, seating, toilets and other administrative arrangements for women employees.
- In accordance with instructions of the Department of Personnel and Training, appointment on compassionate grounds is offered to close relatives of Prasar Bharati employees who die while in service, including female members of the family of the deceased.
- Prasar Bharati staff like Technicians, Sr. Technicians, Engineering Assistants, Sr. Engineering Assistants etc. are shift duty staff, which is incidental to their service. To the extent possible, arrangements are made for dropping of employees, including women employees, during late night shift duty and odd hours.
- The regular staff (men and women alike), are paid Government approved pay scales. All employees including female employees are granted leave in accordance with the government rules on the subject.
- All employees including female employees are entitled to terminal benefits at par with government employees.
- All employees are entitled to Central Government Health Scheme where available.

At other places, employees are given the benefit of Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules. Under these Rules, Private Medical Practitioners are appointed as Authorized Medical Attendants for employees and their families. Wherever requested, separate Authorized Medical Attendants are appointed for women.

 AIR has a system of encouraging and providing incentives to its employees by way of grant of Akashvani Annual Awards for Programmes as well as for Technical Excellence.
 A number of women have been awarded prizes under this scheme.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Committee on Empowerment of Women, a new category of Awards i.e. Best Women's Programme has also been introduced under Akashvani Annual Awards from 2009.

RESERVATION FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES


- The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all, including persons with disabilities. The Government of India enacted "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995", in the effort to ensure equal opportunities for persons with disabilities and their full participation in nation building.
- As per the instructions issued by the Department of Personnel and Training (DOPT) of the Government of India for persons with disabilities reservation is now available in all groups of posts in case of direct recruitment. In case of promotion, reservation is available when promotions are made from Group 'D' to Group 'C' and within Group 'C' identified posts.
- Prasar Bharati has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation for PWD. All relevant policy directions and instructions issued by DOP&T from time to time are being followed.





Statewise no. of Transmitters is given at Annexure-II. In terrestrial mode, DD 1 (National) Channel coverage is estimated to be available to about 92% population of the country. Terrestrial coverage of DD News Channel is estimated to be available to about 49% population. Area-wise coverage of DD 1 and DD News Channel is 81% and 26% respectively.

FREE-TO-AIR DTH "DD DIRECT +"

Doordarshan launched its free-to-air DTH service "DD Direct +" in December, 2004 with a bouquet of 33 TV channels. This service was started with the primary objective of providing TV coverage to the areas hitherto uncovered by terrestrial transmitters. Capacity of DTH Platform has subsequently been augmented to 59 TV channels. DTH signals can be received anywhere in the country (except Andaman & Nicobar Islands) with the help of small sized dish receive units. For A&N Islands, DTH service in C-band with a bouquet of 10 channels was started in September, 2009.

DD National provides live coverage of National Events of the year like Republic Day Parade; Independence Day celebrations; President's and Prime Minister's addresses to the Nation; Joint Session of Parliament; important debates in the Parliament, Presentation of Railway and General Budgets; Question Hour in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha; Election Results and Analysis; Sports Events; Prime Minister's NCC Rally; Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas; International Film Festival of India 2012 at Goa and Presentation of National Film Awards. Arrangements have been made with Lok Sabha TV for live telecast of assumption of office by the President and Vice President.

150 Years of Bombay and Chennai High Courts, Rabindra Nath Tagore and 100 years of Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya were covered extensively this year.


Mahakumbh Mela 2013 held at Allahabad from January 14 to March 10, 2013 was also covered live. The TV series 'Awakening India on Swami Vivekanand' produced by Doordarshan in collaboration with Ramakrishna Mission ran for more than a year, exhorting the youth of India to imbibe the ideals of Swami Vivekanand. Opening and Closing Ceremony Celebrations of the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekanand on January 12 and January 18, 2013 respectively were covered live.

Campaigns conducted by various Govt. departments (Vikas Chakra special programmes), developmental programmes, socially relevant programmes e.g. Healthy India, Pulse Polio Campaign, Anti-Cancer, Leprosy, Tuberculosis, Dengue, Swine Flu and other health related issues, Special Campaign for Primary Education for all, AIDS, consumer education, Road Safety, free legal aid to weaker sections of society etc. were given wide coverage over the entire network.

Popular evening serials telecast on DD National are Sankatmochan Hanumaan, Kanaphusi, Hum Phir Milenge, Hum Tumko Na Bhool Payaenge, Nancy, Yeh Zindagi Hai Gulshan, The Command Force, Pechhan...Astitwa Ki, Talaash, Imtihaan, Manzil Apni Apni, Detective Wagle, Sabse Bade Ladaiyaa etc.

In the first such collaborative event of its kind, Doordarshan in partnership with 'Star Plus', simultaneously broadcast 13 episodes of a special show entitled 'Satyameva Jayate', featuring Amir Khan, between 11.00 AM to 12.30 PM every Sunday from May 6-July 29, 2012.

Project "Coke Studio" popularises new experiments in Indian & Western music including Fusion among the youth of the country. Ten episodes of this show were telecast every Saturday at 8.30 PM. commencing from July 7, 2012. The Epic Ramayan in collaboration with Zee TV was telecast from 11.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon every Sunday for 72 weeks from August 12, 2012. "Jamunia - Tasveer Badalte Bharat Ki" produced in collaboration with the Song and Drama Division of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting was telecast every Sunday morning.

The Education component continues to be drawn from varied sources such as Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), University Grants Commission (UGC) and Central Institute of Educational Technology (SIET)/NCERT. "Manthan" in collaboration with German TV and Vigyan Prasar Programmes by the Ministry of Science & Technology were new innovative programmes. Another notable programme was Upanishad Ganga.

DD National telecast a series of programmes on the welfare of women like - Kahin Der Na Ho Jaye, Bin Bitiya Aangan Soona, Saraswatichandra, Tum Dena Saath Mera, Aur Ek Kahani, Hari Mirchi Lal Mirchi.

Many new innovative/youth oriented/Talent Hunt and other programmes telecast on DD National this year are:

"Gora" based on the novel by Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore.

- "Ek Tha Rusty" based on stories by Ruskin Bond.

The information component on DD National is based largely on an in-house production 'News and Current Affairs'. DD Samachar at 8.00 P.M was transformed to News Night (in Hindi) from February 4, 2013. Feature films are telecast on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 8.30 PM to midnight with award winning Regional Films telecast on the second and fourth Sunday of the month.

Some of the major events covered by DD News this year include World Biodiversity Convention at Hyderabad, US Presidential elections, developments in Syria, Egypt, Israel, Palestine, Afghanistan, besides India's engagements with neighbours like Pakistan, Bangladesh and China. Special programmes Janwani and Janadesh were produced to bring out socio-political as well as psephological issues during the elections.

Focussed and comprehensive coverage of the Hon'ble President and Prime Minister's tours, both domestic and abroad, to highlight India's diplomatic engagement with the global community. PM's visit to Myanmar, Mexico (for G 20 Summit), Brazil (UN Conference on Sustainable Development), Iran for NAM Summit and Cambodia for India-ASEAN Summit were covered. Extensive live coverage from Delhi and other cities during important visits by foreign dignitaries were also covered.

The Business News Desk covered a number of issues related to economic policy decisions of the government, developments in the corporate world, personal finance, international economy and stock markets in its daily news coverage in 'Business Wrap' from Delhi in the evening and 'Business Hour' from Mumbai in the afternoon. Half an hour special programme on FDI in retail was done by Business Desk.

DD news telecasts four sports bulletins, three in Hindi and one in English. The inaugural Asian Hockey Championship Tournament in China won by the Indian men's team was extensively covered with field reports through special arrangement. The first-ever F1 race held in the country at the Buddha International Circuit, Greater Noida and London Olympics 2012 were covered extensively by DD News. In addition, extensive coverage was provided for 2012 T-20 World cup from Sri Lanka, Nehru Football cup and other sporting events.

In the development communication segment, a special programme, 'Jaanne ka Haque', is telecast in Hindi twice a week to promote awareness on the 'Right to Information Act, 2005'. 'Mere Desh Ki Dharti' is a special programme in Hindi telecast twice a week to highlight initiatives like Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MNREGA), National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), and Rajiv Gandhi Rural Electrification Programme etc. The focus of the programme was on operational deficiencies and benefits being accrued to the targeted audiences. Another special programme, 'Mehnat Rang Layegi', telecast in Hindi twice a week, focusses on career and employment opportunities, while 'Ehsaas', telecast in Hindi twice a week, takes a detailed look at socio-economic issues.

Special programmes on Bundelkhand, plight of weavers, artisans, farmers etc. were also broadcast. Daily special discussions by expert panels on domestic and global issues were broadcast in 'Charcha Mein' (in Hindi) and 'Late Edition' (in English) on alternate days. In addition to these, discussions on issues relating to Lok Pal and Lokayuktas, interview based programmes on the contribution of distinguished persons in different walks of life were organised on a regular basis.

Highlights of the special programmes on DD News:

- 'Focus' (a discussion based current affairs programme) in Hindi for five days a week.
- Two weekly interview-based programmes 'Ek Mulaqat' in Hindi and 'Tete- a-Tete' in English
- An audience based programme 'Aamne –Saamne'
- Two programmes for the youth 'Gen next' and 'Campus Week'
- Two weekly programmes in the art, culture and entertainment segment 'Rang Tarang' and 'Cinema Is Hafte'

DD News has 29 functional Regional News Units/ Bureaus across the country located in Agartala, Ahmedabad, Aizwal, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chennai, Chandigarh, Guwahati, Hissar, Hyderabad, Imphal, Itanagar, Jaipur, Jalandhar, Jammu, Kohima, Kolkata, Leh, Lucknow, Mumbai, Patna, Panaji, Ranchi, Raipur, Shillong, Shimla, Srinagar and Thiruvananthapuram. All

29 RNUs plan and execute special stories on Centre's Flagship Programmes like MNREGA, Bharat Nirman, Sarva Siksha Abhiyan, Mid-Day Meal, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme, NRHM, JNNURM and Right to Information Act in their local news bulletins and Current Affairs programmes. These RNUs telecast 100 bulletins daily in 21 languages/dialects.

In the first six months of 2012-13, DD News started two new RNUs at Shillong and Leh. From July 1, 2012, RNU Shillong has started telecasting two news bulletins of 15 minutes in Khasi and English, respectively. From November 19, 2012 RNU Leh has started telecasting a 10-minute bulletin in Ladakhi.

To improve newsgathering from districts/town levels, a new panel of stringers' was put in place in Haryana, Goa, Punjab, Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra.

Through DD News window, 14 RNUs provide regional news and showcase stories on flagship programmes in three regional windows i.e. "Metro Scan", "State Scan" and "Rajyon Se Samachar". RNUs contribute news on important developments from social, cultural and economic sectors in their respective regions to the DD News Channel. They also provide live inputs such as Phone-Ins and hot switches and ensure news updates from the region for National Bulletins.

Doordarshan News website **www.ddinews.gov.in**.provides the latest news updates for netizens. It also live streams Doordarshan News bulletins, which have got a good response from within and outside the country. The Top Story and four Headlines of the Homepage are linked to the official website of Government of India **(www.india.gov.in).**

DD BHARATI

DD Bharati Channel, which was started in January 2002 as a niche channel for culture, health and children was re-launched in a new avatar in 2012-13. The focus of the channel is mainly Art and Culture. DD Bharati has a fixed point chart (FPC) for music and dance, arts and crafts, traditions, festivals, giving unequivocal coverage in this segment. One of the big attractions on DD Bharati is the live coverage of dance & music festivals and other cultural celebrations.

DD Bharati has partnered various national and international public institutions and trusts to acquire and premiere programmes from their archives.DD Bharati is the only channel which has the copyright to telecast events organized with partner institutions like Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), Films Division, Chatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalay of Mumbai, Indira Gandhi National Centre of Arts.

Through these partnerships, programmes such as Raza Foundation; Ananya Festival; Tansen Festival (MP); Hari Vallabh Sangeet Sammelan, Jalandhar (Punjab); Boat Races (Kerala); Rath Yatra

(Odisha); Khajuraho festival; Konark Dance Festival, Odisha; Begum Akhtar Centenary Celebration – Karejwa Mein Lage Katar; Platinum Jubilee Sangeet Samaroh of Bhartia Vidya Bhawan; Goati Pua Dance Festival, Odisha; Rajrani Music Festival, Bhubaneswar and live telecast of Special Kirtan Darbar at Sultanpur Lodhi on Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Jayanti were telecast by DD Bharati.

The extensive coverage provided for these events by DD Bharati re-affirmed its commanding position as the sole national culture channel of the country. Talks are underway for similar partnerships with Sahitya Academy, Sangeet Natak Academy and the Ministry of Culture.

DD Bharati has reserved slots for the North East India and world cultures. It has signed a special agreement with the Embassy of Japan to showcase special events to mark 60 years of Indo-Japan Diplomatic Relations and with the Hungarian Culture Centre to mark 125th birth anniversary of renowned painter Amrita Shergil, among others.

DD URDU

- 24x7 channel launched on August 15, 2006
- Features a mix programmes on heritage, culture, literature, information, education and social issues specific to the target audience
- In March 2013, 103 programmes were commissioned including novels/fiction by Urdu writers like Krishan Chander, Saadat Hasan Manto, Qurartul Ain Hyder, Munsi Premchand and subjects like literature, music, science, current affairs.
- Since January 2013, a number of new initiatives have been taken to increase the number of in-house programmes.
- Besides entertainment, feature film (thrice a week), other informative programmes of specific interest to the Urdu speaking audience, government schemes for minorities, events in neighbouring countries, face to face with celebrities etc. have been launched.
- A daily programme titled Sargarmiyan gives a roundup of all important happenings in and around Delhi.

In view of the public service mandate of Prasar Bharati to promote sports, Prasar Bharati has exempted the cash outflow principle in respect of the following:-
 - Armed and Para Military Forces
 - Games for the disabled
 - Education and cultural institutions.
 - Sports in rural areas-National or Regional level
 - Promotion of Women's sports/events irrespective of discipline

REGIONAL LANGUAGE SATELLITE CHANNELS (RLSC)

- Doordarshan operates 11 Regional Language Satellite Channels, which telecast programmes around the clock in regional/ local languages.
- These telecasts are available in terrestrial mode in the State during regional transmission and in satellite mode at other times for viewers (including those outside the state).
- Programmes for RLSC originate at Regional Kendras in regional languages and dialects.

DD SAHYADRI

Supported by Doordarshan Studios in Mumbai, Pune and Nagpur, DD Sahyadri has become a household name in Maharashtra, largely because of programmes with high production values. 




OTHER SECTIONS OF DOORDARSHAN

DOORDARSHAN COMMERCIAL SERVICE

Advertisements carried by Doordarshan for goods and services are governed by a comprehensive advertising code. Advertisements for cigarettes, tobacco products, liquor, wine and other intoxicants are not accepted. Advertisements in Hindi and English are telecast on DD National and DD News channels, while advertisements in regional languages are telecast on the Regional Language Channels. Bookings are normally accepted through accredited and registered agencies.


The commercial revenue of Doordarshan has been on an upswing. This has been achieved by improved slot management and introduction of high quality programming on various Doordarshan channels, marketing of sporting events etc.

The commercial revenue of Doordarshan during 2012-13 is Rs. 1294.08 crores.



DEVELOPMENT COMMUNICATION DIVISION

The Corporation's primary revenue comes from corporate and government advertising. Over the years as the number of private TV channels grew, the public broadcaster's revenue faced stiff competition. To face this challenge, the Corporation set up the Development Communication Division in 2001 to enhance its revenue from Government agencies. Development Communication Division offers turn-key solution to harness the untapped potential of Government Ministries, Departments and PSUs. It provides single window service for the production and broadcast of messages related to different welfare schemes of the government.



The gap between net and gross marks DD's contribution as bonus airtime.

A marketing division with proactive approach, dynamic marketing tools and strategies and on-time launch and completion, the Development Communication Division of Doordarshan has recorded continuous growth in revenue, contributing over 42% to its total revenue in 2012-13.

In order to fulfil the client's needs, Doordarshan undertook production of major campaigns, beginning with a country-wide bi-media (AIR&DD) campaign for the Ministry of Rural Development. This began the revival of in-house productions in Doordarshan. Beginning 2002, Doordarshan has been producing the Ministry of Health and Family Welfares flagship campaign 'Kalyani', recognized by WHO as 'One of Top Global Innovations', amongst several other awards.

The campaign, beginning with 8 States, grew gradually to 21 States and this year (2012-13), it has been expanded to 30 Stations of DD as 'Swasth Bharat', the biggest public health communication campaign in the world, bringing to DD a revenue of Rs. 150 crores per annum. The campaign was launched by the Union Health Minister on April 7, the World Health Day, in Doordarshan studios. DD has produced 6,222 health programmes up to March 31, 2013 in 19 languages and 17 dialects.

NARROW-CASTING

Narrow-casting by Doordarshan started in the year 2000, initially involving 12 LPTs and included programmes of local genre telecast once/twice a week. Since 2004, Doordarshan has been producing the flagship project of the Union Ministry of Agriculture.

This project has a three tier approach:

- On the National Channel: Country specific, agriculture programmes are telecast 6 days a week (Monday to Saturday), from 6.30 AM to 7.00 AM.
- On 18 Regional Channels: State specific agriculture programmes are telecast 5 days a week (Monday to Friday), for a duration of 30 mins. on respective Regional Language Satellite Channels (RLSC) from 6.00 PM to 6.30 PM.
- In "Narrowcasting" Mode: Area specific information, produced twice a week, telecast 5 days a week (Monday to Friday), in the evening, through PGFs and Regional Kendras over 180 transmitters across the country. The programme caters to area specific needs of the farmers of more than 140 districts across the country. All aspects of Agriculture, Horticulture, Veterinary Sciences and Fisheries are included in the programmes. It also includes information on Weather, Agriculture, News Bulletin, Mandi Bhav (market prices), publicity of Minimum Support Price (MSP), and campaigns on seed treatment during Kharif and other information provided by the DAC, Ministry of Agriculture, in each Krishi Darshan.

ABU ROBOCON NATIONAL CONTEST (MARCH 2013)

ABU-Robocon 2013 National Contest was organized by Doordarshan in association with MIT from March 7 to 9, 2013 at Balewadi Stadium, Pune. This International Event is organized every year by the Asia-Pacific Broadcasting Union (ABU), with a view to encourage scientific temperament of undergraduate engineering students in the Asia-Pacific region.

FILMS SECTION

Doordarshan continued to telecast serialized films in the slot 'Bioscope' from Monday to Wednesday between 11.00 p.m. to 12.00 p.m. Telecasting frequency of Swaran Kamal and Rajat Kamal Award Winning Films on National Network has been increased to twice a month (on 2nd and 4th Sunday) at 11.30 p.m. Many award winning films were shown on Doordarshan in its regional window.

DD now has not only increased its marketing revenue, but has also made inroads directly to the film makers who were otherwise not willing to offer their films directly to Doordarshan.

HINDI SECTION

This section makes efforts to promote the progressive use of Hindi in the Directorate and its subordinate offices. The main activities of the section during the year 2012-13:-

- Hindi Fortnight from September 14 to 28, 2012. Various competitions were held during this period and cash prizes were given to successful participants.
- The Committee of Parliamentarians on Official Language inspected five Doordarshan offices during the year.
- A Regional Rajbhasha Sammelan was organized on January 18 & 19, 2013 at Ahmedabad. Directors of Doordarshan Kendras and Station Engineers of High Power Transmitters and Doordarshan Maintenance Centres located in southern region and Gujarat, Maharashtra and Goa participated.

PR UNIT

PR Section of the Directorate is a small and composite unit which undertakes Media and Publicity activities. The department ensures all forms of communication, advertising, direct mailers, press releases to publicize activities and programmes of Doordarshan.

A complete guide to Doordarshan Programmes 'DD This Week' is published by the PR Unit and circulated to the media, including agencies like PTI, UNI, newspapers and DTH Platforms, for

their Electronic Programme Guides. PR Section updates the Doordarshan Website on a daily basis to keep viewers updated on programme information.

Initiatives for publicity of London Olympics on DD Sports fetched rich dividends, as DD Sports emerged as the most watched Sports Channel during the Olympics. Publicity for programmes like "Satyamev Jayate", "Coke Studio", "Gora", "Ek Tha Rusty II" and feature films was undertaken through newspaper advertisements and media interaction. Illuminated bill boards are installed along the boundary walls of Doordarshan.

DD-ARCHIVES

DD Archives started in 2004 with state of the art archiving technology to preserve rare and outstanding programmes of Doordarshan, produced over the last 50 years.

DD-Archives has been putting up stalls in fairs and events organized in Delhi and outside Delhi e.g.; NRI meet in Jaipur, International Film Festivals, Crafts Mela Dilli Haat, Trade Fairs, Book fairs etc.

During the year 2012-13, the Audience Research Unit of Doordarshan with its 19 field units located at Doordarshan Kendras all over the country, involved in research studies on various aspects of broadcasting, contributed as follows:

- Preparation of Annual Report of Prasar Bharati for 2011-12 and Ministry of I&B for the year 2012-13.
- Rural DART Panel Survey covering the complete country. Based on its regular feedback on rural DART, analysis is provided to DG: DD.
- Final Report "Study on provision of DTH receivers-study of its usefulness and viewers" was submitted to Engineering section for further submission to Ministry of I & B.
- Study on viewership of DD Kashir and other TV Channels in Kashmir.
- Preparation of draft for filing case against TAM in the Competition Commission of India.

- RFP issued for selection of Consultancy Agency for Development and Implementation of Doordarshan's Revenue Growth Strategy.
- Study on "Impact of Electricity Outage on TV Viewership" by DDK: Chennai.

Engineering Activities 2012-13:

Developmental Activities during 2012-13:

DIGITIZATION

- Projects to fully digitize 31 partially digital and 8 analogue studios are under implementation (locations given at Annexure-I). All major equipment have been procured and installed/ are under installation. Full digitization of these studio centres is expected to be completed in 2013-14. (Total number of transmitters are given in Annexure II)
- Projects to establish 40 digital high power transmitters are under implementation (locations given at Annexure-III). In the first phase, 19 digital transmitters are to be installed and the remaining 21 digital transmitters will be installed in the second phase. Order for procurement of 19 digital HPTs has been placed.

DTH EXPANSION

Project for the upgradation of Doordarshan's DTH platform from the present 59 to 97 TV channels is under implementation and expected to be completed during 2013-14. All the channels would be free and no subscription would be payable by the viewers.

HIGH DEFINITION TELEVISION (HDTV)

HDTV refers to video having resolution 5 times higher than traditional television systems (Standard-Definition TV). Main features of HDTV are: crystal clear and noise free picture; more realistic colors; wide screen picture and more viewing realism.

The following HDTV Projects are under implementation:

- HDTV Studios at Delhi and Mumbai Installation of HDTV Studio at DDK, Delhi has been completed and at DDK, Mumbai is nearing completion.
- HDTV field production, post production and preview facilities have been set up at Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai and Chennai.
- HDTV transmitters at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai are expected to be installed during 2013-14.
- Multi Camera OB vans for outdoor production at Delhi and Mumbai expected during 2013-14.

MODERNIZATION, AUGMENTATION AND REPLACEMENT

It has been the constant endeavour of Doordarshan to modernize its network by replacing old equipment with the state-of-the-art equipment and augment existing facilities. The following major projects are under implementation/ implemented for modernization and augmentation of Doordarshan network:

- Terrestrial transmitters
 - High power TV transmitter at Mahboobnagar (interim set up) commissioned on December 8, 2012.
 - Automode LPT (500 Watt in (1+1) configuration) commissioned at Chanderi (MP), Jhansi (UP) & Nainital (Uttarakhand).
 - Order for replacement of the following old High Power Transmitters (HPTs) has been placed:

- Order for equipment has been placed for the upgradation from single channel system to two channel system of existing Earth Stations at Leh, Port Blair, Hissar, Chandigarh and Panaji.
- Installation of new Earth Stations at Vijayawada, Indore, Gwalior and Rajkot has been completed.

12th PLAN PROPOSALS

Emphasis in the 12th Plan proposals of Doordarshan has been laid on digitlization, expansion of DTH, modernization, augmentation and replacement of Studio, Transmitter and Satellite broadcast equipment, HDTV, global coverage of DD International channel, strengthening of coverage in border areas, besides distribution of DD programmes on alternate delivery platform and civil infrastructure augmentation.

Important Coverage

London Olympics-2012

Doordarshan was one of the Right Holder Broadcasters (RHBs) for the Olympic Games 2012, from July 27 to August 12, in London, UK. Doordarshan extensively covered all the events that had Indian participation. Doordarshan deployed 11 field cameras for ENG based coverage for events like Shooting, Boxing, Badminton, Wrestling, Lawn Tennis Hockey, Athletics and Archery. Customized commentaries were also generated from these venues, including the opening and closing ceremonies. Multi-camera studio was set-up at I.B.C., London for live interaction with Delhi Studio. A programme of 30 minutes duration titled "India at London" was produced daily.

1. Method of accounting

The accounts of the Corporation are prepared under the historical cost convention using the accrual method of accounting. On this basis revenue and related assets are recognised when earned and expenses are recognised when the obligation is incurred.

2. Inventory Valuation

Stores and Spares (including machinery spares) are valued at cost.

3. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at transfer amount in respect of assets transferred to Prasar Bharati and the corresponding credit is to "Loan In Perpetuity".

Transfer of Assets by the Central Government is subject to actual valuation and verifications.

In respect of capital expenditure incurred on different schemes undertaken by AIR and DD all related & associated expenses are capitalized.

4. Method of depreciation

Depreciation is charged on straight line method at rates computed on useful life of the assets prescribed based on the IMG recommendations.

Accordingly, the rates adopted are: Building-2%, Studio, Transmitter, Machinery & Equipments and Other Fixed assets-10%, Electrical installation- 4%, Vehicles-20%, Furniture & Fixtures-6.25%, Office Equipments-16.67% and Computers-33.33%.

5. Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are accounted for at the prevailing exchange rates at the date of transactions.

6. License Fee and Consultancy fee

License fee and consultancy fee is recognized when receivable.

1. Prasar Bharati Broadcasting Corporation of India is established as general public

utility institution and fall under the category of "Not-for-Profit Organization". Accordingly, based on Generally accepted accounting practices, and Section 145 of Income Tax

Act, it can follow either cash or mercantile system of accounting.

Considering the organization structure and prevalent past practices and the simplicity aspects, cash basis of accounting was being adopted upto 31.03.2005. From 01.04.2005 the accounts are initially compiled on cash basis at field unit level and subsequently converted into accrual basis to the extent pos≠≠sible, based on the information collected from both the Directorates. Prasar Bharati Board however, decided to give effect to complete switch over from cash to accrual accounting at field unit also. However, it would take time due to complex nature of organisational structure and lack of trained accounting staff at field units.

Bank Guarantee of Rs. 24.60 crore of M/s SIS Live was invoked. In this regard arbitration proceedings have already been started. M/s SIS live submitted their claim to the tune of Rs. 106.88 crore as per contract, 24.60 towards BG and Damages of GBP 9381,098. The amount of Rs. 106.88 crore has also been included in the liabilities. Damages claimed by M/s SIS Live are not acknowledged as liability as the Corporation has also submitted a counter claim for the amount of Rs.147.60 crore.

- 5. The Group of Ministers on Prasar Bharati has decided to convert the Loan in Perpetuity & Capital Loan into grant and to waive off interest there on. However, Notification in this regard is yet to issue.
- 6. The amount of Fixed Assets transferred at book value to Prasar Bharati by the Central Government has been considered based on Chief Controller of Accounts' letter No. CCA/I&B/2002 dated 3.09.02 and is also subject of physical verification and valuation.
- 7. Deficit arising would be met out from the Loan received from Ministry of I&B. Also some major liabilities such as repayment of Loan & interest thereon and Spectrum & Space Segment Charges not required to be paid as GoM has agreed to waive off such liabilities.
- 8. Unspent balance of Rs. 66.37 crore for the previous year 2010-11 has been adjusted by Ministry from the current year release of Capital Loan.
- 9. 9. Taxation

Prasar Bharati is registered under section 12A read with section 12AA(1)(b) of Income Tax Act as Non-Profit Organization . However, the same has been withdrawn by Income Tax Deptt. from the financial year 2008-09 vide their letter dt.13.02.2012

- 10. Leave salary and Pension contribution are paid to Government of India as Prasar Bharati's contribution towards employees pensioners benefits as notification of transfer of employees to the Entity has not been issued.
- 11. Inter Office Transactions Accounts

These represent remittances in transit at the end of financial year, accordingly they are shown as such in the accounts. On a review it was noted that this and the figures under Capital Work in Progress' require immediate reconciliation. Accordingly, the work of reconciliation, zone-wise, outsourced to the firms of Chartered Accountant for completing the work in time bound manner, which is under process.

- 12. Deposit Works
 - Amounts received from parties for deposit work is after adjusting expenditure against such work.
- 13. CAG's fee for auditing of accounts of Prasar Bharati has been provided for.
- 14. The figures of Sundry debtors-good also includes interest component of Rs.70.45 crore.
- 15. No provision has been made in the Accounts for doubtful debts in respect of legal action initiated by the corporation for recovery, as the extent of doubtfulness is not ascertainable in the current situation. However, to ascertain the confirm figures of doubtful debts, reconciliation exercise is under process.
- 16. Provisions for Spectrum & Space Segment Charges have been provided on estimated basis. The Group of Ministers on Prasar Bharati has decided to waive off the accumulated arrears of Spectrum & Space Segment charges. However, Notification in this regard is yet to issue.
- 17. An amount of Rs. 660,20,187/- has been refunded by ITPO in respect of unspent balance on account of CWG-2010 which is reflected in Sch. 18 under the head "Others".
- 18. Income includes Service Tax component as and where applicable.
- 19. Service Tax Deptt. issued a recovery Order No.16/RDN/2011 dt.05.05.2011 for the short Service Tax paid for the period 2003-04 to 2007-08. Accordingly on same basis amount payable for the financial years 2008-09 to 2010-11 also worked out and an amount of Rs. 178,71,63,705/= deposit including penal interest aggregating Rs.65,18,08,110/-.
 - Interest payment is reflected in Sch. 23 under the head "Other Finance charges. Remaining amount including penalty on service tax amounting to Rs.21,77,66,887/- has been shown in Sch. 20 under the head "Service Tax which also include Service Tax for the current year.
 - However, an appeal has been filed to get refund of the Service Tax demand since it does not allow the corresponding CENVAT not availed off and contains gross calculation errors in the computation made by the Service Tax Deptt.
- 20. Vide office order No.297/2012-PPC, Brig (Retd.) V.A.M Hussain Member (P) also looks after the work of Member (F). Accordingly Accounts are signed by him.
